

What is a nominated scholarship?

In order to apply for certain undergraduate scholarships (mainly in the US and Canada) you must be nominated by your high school. Usually the school is only allowed to nominate one candidate.

Before applying, check the eligibility for each scholarship on the university’s website.

You may apply to be nominated for any nominated scholarship you have found yourself, if you are eligible.

Does being nominated guarantee me a scholarship?

No. Scholarships are extremely competitive; recipients will be selected from a pool of nominees from schools all over the world.

Who should apply?

- You must be serious about going to that particular university. If you are selected and do not apply to that university, you have taken away somebody else’s chance
- You must have an outstanding academic record and close to full attendance
- You must be a current A2 student
- You must meet the scholarship’s eligibility criteria which can be found on its website.

Some scholarships consider:

- Leadership positions, special talent or active school community member
- Your citizenship status (ex: are open to international students only)
- Financial need may be preferred or required (You must be unable to attend without scholarship assistance). You must fill out the financial information on the form in order to be considered.

How do I apply?

1. Complete the Request for Nomination for each scholarship for which you wish to be considered. Type into the form itself – the fields will expand to hold your information. Do not change the font or font size.
2. If more than one, please rank them in order of preference. (1 = 1st choice). (Only one choice per number)
3. If you apply for more than one, some information can be the same in all the Personal Statements

How is the nominee chosen?

1. Only students who provide a complete application by the deadline will be considered for nomination.
 - a. You will not be notified if anything is missing. Please ensure completeness before submission.
 - b. Students will not be considered for scholarships that do not meet their financial need.
 - c. The school may choose not to nominate anyone if there is no sufficiently competitive candidate
2. A Lyceum committee will determine who will be nominated, based on the applications.
3. The nominees will then meet with their college counselors, plan their application to the selected university and submit the required documents for the scholarship before the university’s deadline.
