

Subject Pre-Requisites for 2022-2024

AS ENGLISH: (Compulsory)

Students can choose one of the English courses from the following options however English General is studied by most students:

Options:

1. English General – AS (8021)

Pre-requisite: B in English. Taught in First Year. English General helps improve writing and comprehension skills through reading, writing, reflection, discussion and debates on local and world issues.

2. English Language (9093)

Pre-requisites: Strong command of and interest in English Language and excellent English grades. An attested photocopy of a dated and marked Class 11 English Language composition test with the topic/questions attached.

AS Level

In the First Year, students learn how to analyse various genres, write for an audience and write imaginative/creative descriptive pieces. All students will sit the AS Level examination at the end of their First Year.

A Level

Students who have strong grades in AS Language and wish to study the A Level course may do so and sit the A Level examination at the end of Second Year.

The focus is on language as a means of self expression and on language acquisition.

3. Global Perspectives and Research AS (9239)

Pre-requisites: Strong command of and excellent English grades with a strong interest in English Language and reading.

AS Level

- Research and write an essay of 1,750 words on a global issue. Students will learn how to do research as they engage, reflect and critically analyse global issues.
- Research a topic on a local issue with a team, then individually create and present an 8 minute presentation. Then write an 800-word reflective essay.
- Sit a 1 and a half hour paper. The process helps students develop discipline in their powers of observation, thinking, researching, writing and communicating.

MATHEMATICS:

1. <u>Mathematics (9709)</u>

Pre-requisites: Applicants who have not studied Additional Mathematics must have a strong grasp and interest in the subject which is reflected in strong grades in Mathematics throughout high school years. They will be placed in a non-Add Math group in their First Year.

Applicants who have studied Additional Mathematics are required to have a B+ in Mathematics and Additional Mathematics throughout.

The Mathematics course consists of:

- 2 compulsory pure math components: P1 & P2
- 2 elective components: Mechanics (M) & Statistics (S)
- First Year students take P1 & S1
- Second Year science students take P3 & M1
- Second Year non-science students take P3 & S2



2. Further Mathematics (9231)

Pre-requisites: A* in Mathematics and Additional Mathematics at school and at the O Level.

This extremely challenging subject should only be taken by those strongly committed to studying it. A Further Mathematics student develops advanced knowledge and skills in Mathematics.

SCIENCE SUBJECTS:

Science subjects require strong quantitative skills which is why all Science students at The Lyceum are required to study AS level Mathematics.

1. Biology (9700)

Pre-requisites: A strong academic profile with an A average in Biology throughout.

2. Chemistry (9701)

Pre-requisites: A strong academic profile with an A average in Chemistry throughout.

3. Physics (9702)

Pre-requisites: A strong academic profile with an A average in Physics and Mathematics throughout. Applicants with an Add Math background are preferred.

BUSINESS SUBJECTS:

Pre-requisites: Strong quantitative skills and a keen desire to study business subjects.

1. Accounting (9706)

Pre-requisites: A/B in Accounts throughout.

2. Business Studies (9609)

Pre-requisites: A/B in Mathematics and a strong desire to study Business.

3. Computer Science (9608)

Pre-requisites: A strong background in Mathematics.

4. <u>Economics (9708)</u>

Pre-requisites: Strong analytical skills and an A/B in Mathematics and English.

SOCIAL SCIENCE SUBJECTS:

Pre-requisites: An excellent command of the English language with the motivation and stamina required for reading, reflection and critical analysis.

1. English Literature (9695)

Pre-requisites: Applicants who have a Literature background are required to have an A/B in English Language throughout.

Applicants who do not have a Literature background but are keen and have a strong command over English language, can sit a written aptitude test.

Applicants are required to submit one marked English test taken during the final year of their O Levels. The date of the test must be clearly stated.



2. <u>History (9389)</u>

Students will need to engage with the subject and be willing to think 'out of the box' as they analyse the texts critically. A strong interest in the subject is important.

3. Psychology (9990)

Students will engage with theories and research methodologies in a rather scientific manner as they study different ways of understanding human psychology.

4. Sociology (9699)

Students will be taught theories of different thinkers and research methodologies to help them study society and the institutions within society through different lens.

5. Art and Design (9704)

Pre-requisites: Preference given to applicants who have studied Art at the O Level. However, exceptional applicants who do not have a strong art portfolio but are keen to study Art may sit for an art test.
